Limo's group is doing wonderful with many hours resting, as is common in the dry season, when fruit is scarce and movement decreases. The four babies in the group are growing, spending more and more time away from their mothers, and learning to climb the surrounding shrubs. After Ekombe (Indolia's child) and Ebuka (Wusa's child), it was the turn of Mopatapata's child to be baptized. Our trackers have chosen the name Edutu, which like Ekombe refers to a vine whose young leaves gorillas often eat.

Cisneros, an adult male that visits the clearing sporadically has been observed with an open flesh wound close to his right tusk. This injury could be consequence of a fight with another bull. Males with injuries have been observed to throw water and put mud on the wound, which probably calms the pain.


Dzanga Bai data collected in collaboration with the Elephant Listening Project: presence of mammals at the clearing based on the number of individuals counted every 30 minutes from 11:00 to 16:30 each day of the month.

We have increased the number of patrols in the area, as we have seen that the poaching has also increasing.

36 regular patrols were conducted involving 83 rangers. In total 1.663 rangers/days. 2.563 km were traveled on foot.

This resulted in the seizure of 2 manufactured 12-gauge firearms, 10 homemade firearms, 1 war gun AK 47 and 35 ammunitions.

- 1.062 metal snares were dismantled and 300 kilograms of bush meat seized.
- 4 elephants were killed.
- $1\ suspect\ was\ arrested\ and\ judged\ for\ hunting\ in\ the\ National\ Park,\ and\ for\ illegal\ use\ of\ a\ war\ firearm\ AK\ 47.$
- He was convicted to imprisonment for six years.





Community Conservation

Léonie and Robert, the two new BaAka students at the University of Bangui, have integrated very well into their host families (religious congregations in Bangui) with their new classmates. They seem to enjoy this new stage at university, and the start of their training has been positive.

As it seems, it cannot all be good news. After an evaluation of the 10 Baaka students who visit Bayanga high school, the grades obtained by all of them have been below average.

We have held a meeting with the students, their parents, their teachers and the host families to discuss the matter and see how the situation can be changed with the effort of all. For APDS, this education program for BaAka students is a priority.

Two technicians from RFI Planete Radio came to Bayanga to continue the partnership with DSPA and Radio Ndjoku. They assist the community radio station with new material, training sessions on visual reporting, and checking the overall functioning of the station. Max Bale, who created the radio station, has been coming for more than 15 years to Dzanga Sangha.

In order to support Ba'aka farmers in the proper conservation of their peanut and seed harvests, missions were carried for collection and gathering. A total quantity of 217 Ngawi peanuts has already been stored for the next agricultural campaign.

The APDS doctor continued to provide support to the Bayanga Secondary Hospital (HSB) during this month of January. In Januarz we noted that some patients from Monasao migrated and came to the HSB for treatment.

Due to the launch of the recruitment of eco-guards within the APDS, many medical certificates were issued to young people at the health center.
