Celebrating the First Dzanga-Sangha Protected Areas Day

From November 18 to 20, the Central African Republic marked a major milestone with the inaugural Dzanga-Sangha Protected Areas Day. President Faustin Archange Touadéra led the celebrations, highlighting this UNESCO World Heritage site within the Sangha Trinational.

Organized in partnership with WWF and the Helmholtz Institute for One Health, the event celebrated conservation, sustainable development, and the wellbeing of local communities. New social infrastructure and a center for Indigenous peoples were also inaugurated, reinforcing Dzanga-Sangha's role as a national and global model for biodiversity protection and the "One Health" approach.

Presidential Visit to Dzanga Bai



During the visit to Dzanga Bai, the delegation enjoyed an exceptional wildlife viewing session from the observation platform, using binoculars to take in the unique spectacle of forest elephants gathering at the saline.

At the foot of the platform, the President was photographed with the Dzanga Bai researchers and partners from the Elephant Listening Project, who shared insights into their long-term monitoring work.

During the visit the President said: "We will take all necessary measures to develop this site and to protect the elephants that live here, in close collaboration with local communities. We must show the world that there is a unique natural heritage here in the Central African Republic."








Stay at Doli Lodge & Launch of the Solar Power Plant
